Sermon Text:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you. and that your joy may be full ... "

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the Gardener...." - John 15:1 NIV CONTEXT OF THESE VERSES Every Jew, in Jesus' day, when they saw the picture of a vine would have thought "Israel". The vine was a symbol of Israel in the OT.

"You brought us out of Egypt <u>as if we were a vine</u>. You forced out other nations and planted us in the land." - Psalms 80:8 NCV "But I planted you as a <u>special vine</u>, as a very good seed. How then

did you turn into a wild vine that grows bad fruit?" - Jeremiah 2:21 NCV

BIG IDEA

This picture of the Vine or The Living Tree illustrate the dynamics of our relationship with God.

I Am A

"I am the vine you are the branches..." John 15:5

Paul uses this same picture of the vine and the branches in Romans 11 *"grafted in"* – **Romans 11:19** When we put our faith in Christ – we are grafted into the vine (Jesus)

Who am I <u>In Christ</u> "… justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is **in Christ** Jesus" - Romans 3:24

"... the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" - Romans 6:23

> "... sanctified in Christ Jesus " - 1 Corinthians 1:2

"... if anyone is **in Christ**, he is a new **creation**; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." - 2 Corinthians 5:17

"It is not you who support the root, but the root that supports you..." - Romans 11:18
